

Weighted Grades at High School

- I. Beginning with the 2006–07 school year, students taking Advanced Placement classes would have their final average weighted in order to reflect the academic rigor of these classes.
- II. The following weight would be added to their yearly average:
 - A. “A” would be considered worth 5 points on a 4 point grading scale.
 - B. “B” would be considered worth 4 points on a 4 point grading scale.
 - C. “C” would be considered worth 3 points on a 4 point grading scale.
 - D. “D” would be considered worth 2 points on a 4 point grading scale.
 - E. “F” would be considered worth 0 points on a 4 point grading scale.
- III. The weight would be added to the student’s yearly average provided that the student took the test for the class.
- IV. Students who cannot afford to pay for the test will receive scholarships from the school to have the testing fee covered.¹
- V. This weighted average would be used as part of the consideration for graduation honors.

Adopted by Board Action: Oct. 3, 2006; effective July 1, 2006.

¹Any student who qualifies for free or reduced lunch shall have the test fee paid by the school. Students who feel they qualify for a hardship should notify the guidance office prior to signing up for the advance placement test, which is given in May. Guidance would be provided by the instructor in signing up to take the test.
