I. Roll Call

- a. Mr. Lively called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.
- b. All members were present.

II. Pledge of Allegiance

III Approval of Agenda/Adjustments

- a. Mr. Lively announced that check numbers 80550 and 80572 should be voted on separately. Personnel Items G, number 31, and Substitute Secretary, number 2, should also be voted on separately. Mrs. Hoke Webb made the motion to approve the agenda as adjusted. The vote to approve was unanimous.

V. Delegations

- a. Don Dransfield, WVU Extension Agent spoke to the Board, informing them that the dates for Energy Express this year will be June 16 through August 5. The Ham, Bacon, & Egg Show and Sale raised \$108,000 for 4-H members in the Greenbrier Valley.

Mr. Dransfield spoke regarding the Old Board Office and his hope to repurpose it for a 4-H Extension Office. He has support from the County Commission and WVU. The plan would be to renovate the building and also use it as a community center.

VI. Superintendent's Report

- a. Mrs. Basile stated that the JROTC review went well. The Color Guard received a perfect score and the Army reviewers said that was the best performance they have seen at any school. The overall rating for JROTC was proficient.

- b. The essay winners chosen by the Greenbrier Valley Airport Board that will travel to Washington, D. C. on May 15 are Katelyn Roberts, Cody Ramsey, Ashley Page, Whitney Hunt, Christopher Dunn, Bryce Dickerson, Logan DeHart, Brady Davis, Haleigh Ballengee, Megan Amos, Antonella Bianco, and Cade Fisher. The out of state travel request will be listed on the next board agenda along with their itinerary. Colonel Womack will chaperone the trip.
- c. United Way has awarded Monroe County Schools with a \$5000 grant to begin Imagination Library. This will place one book each month in every child's hand, aged birth to five. Local churches and community organizations are helping to raise the additional \$7500 needed to fund the program next year.
- d. United Way also wants to host a summer reading camp for MVS students in grades two through four. A local church would house the event with meals being provided by the Monroe County Schools Office of Child Nutrition, Summer Food Program. Morning transportation would be provided by Monroe County Schools as well.
- e. Mrs. Basile announced that the Special Education Monitoring Report was very good. The only issues found were clerical type issues on IEP documents. Mrs. Basile congratulated Mr. Baker and the Special Education Teachers and staff for their daily efforts with our students.

X. Discussion Items




